We hosted a Macmillan Coffee Morning and After School Cake sale to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Research!

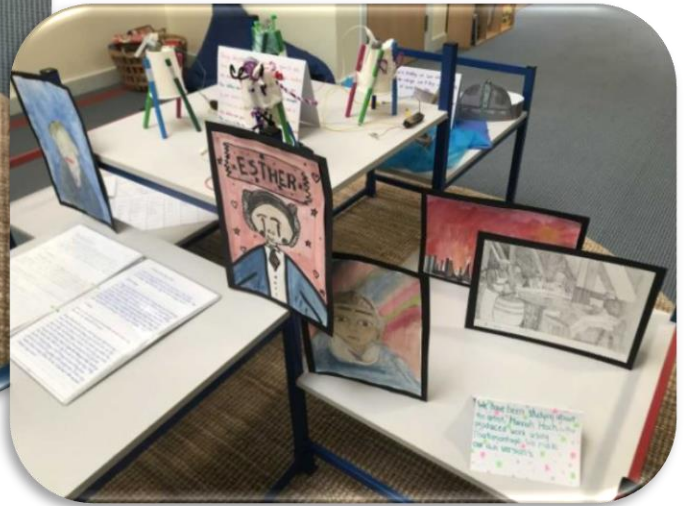
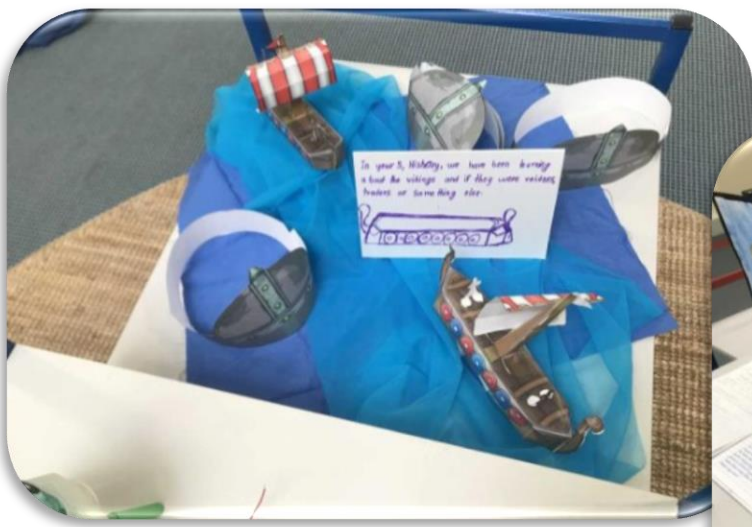
Both events were hugely successful and we had a fantastic time too!

UKS2 have been working hard on creating an eye-catching and informative foyer display that showcases their recent learning.

Year 5 have been exploring the theme of Vikings, considering whether they were settlers, traders, or even invaders. Through historical enquiry, they examined different sources of evidence and discussed how the Vikings influenced life in Britain. In DT, Year 5 showed great resilience while designing and building their own doodlers. Although they faced a few challenges with the construction and movement mechanisms, they persevered with problem-solving and teamwork – and the final results were creative, colourful, and a big success! Meanwhile, Year 6 have delved into the topic of World War II, focusing on the difficult decision of whether to leave or stay during the war. As part of their learning, Year 6 linked their historical knowledge to persuasive writing by taking part in debates about whether families should stay or leave Germany during World War II. They wrote powerful and thought-provoking arguments from different perspectives, considering the dangers, emotions, and difficult decisions faced by people at the time. Their artwork has been inspired by the bold and expressive style of Hannah Höch, resulting in striking self-portraits that reflect both individuality and historical context.

To further support academic achievement, Edward Pauling Primary School has set an attendance target of 97%. We actively promote and reward excellent attendance. Please note that term-time leave is only authorised in **exceptional circumstances** and must be requested in advance.

Unauthorised term-time absences will be referred to the Local Authority, which may result in a fine. While we understand children may occasionally be too unwell to attend, all children should attend school whenever they are well enough. If your child has experienced vomiting or diarrhoea in the past 24 hours, they must stay home.

If attendance falls below our expected standard, you will be invited to meet with us to discuss any concerns and available support. Medical evidence will be required for future absences, and persistent low attendance may lead to referral to the School Attendance Support Service (SASS). For medical appointments, please arrange them outside school hours where possible; if not, please provide proof for authorisation. If your child needs to attend another school for entrance exams, please provide the invitation letter, and **only the exam time will be authorised**. We appreciate your support in helping every child reach their full potential.
